Batman's misogynist attitude is prevalent throughout all the novel. He is an example of alpha-male with a trait of hyper-masculinity in him. He is more prone to incline towards the traditional norms of patriarchal system with a quest of authority, dominance and power in his hands. It is through the assertion of power and control over women, he achieves a feeling of completeness. The norm equips men with an attitude to see women merely as an object to be ruled over where men gets the sole authority over their lives. In Batman's case also we get to see the similar outlook developed by him, where he considers women not merely like objects to be used and distorted as per his desire to achieve his own pleasure. Batman's inhumane acts of cruelties against women throughout the novel signify a feeling of deep contempt and hatred that he has cultivated in his mind. His acts of horrible sexual violence including severe tortures, assaults, and murders are the examples of his inner furies along with the diminished status of women in his eyes where he finds it non-offensive and non-regrettable to inflict harm to them. He considers women as his sole property to be used in any way without having any consideration for their individual lives.

Another negatively taken aspect of patriarchal influence can be traced in his attitude of gaining supremacy
