Two headed snake arm band for the upper hand. She decorated Karobi's hair with mantasha, Chandra chur and makarbala which was unknown by many now-a-days. Sarojini touched each ornament and shared nostalgic thoughts of each ornament who gave and what was the situation behind to get it.

Karobi's grandparents and her in law's dressed in a traditional way as such as grand without leaving their tradition, but fumed with rich thoughts as they were upcoming rich family among others. Karobi's cook in traditional saree of Bengal. She didn't give up the Muslim driver Asif who dressed in his own traditional way as Muslims used to. Chitra insists the traditional dressing way of Mr.Bhattacharyya wearing turban and white dhoti to the temple. She also talks about Anu & Karobi when they were in America, they could wear the dress suits to American Culture but they didn't as they were for their Indian culture. Pia's bond towards Karobi was mentioned to be a **sisterly love**, where she shares everything about her family members, admires Karobi's hair and takes photo to have a nostalgic memory with her. Karobi's bond with Rob Lacey acknowledged as **fatherly love** when she really finds him and get to know about his love towards Anu and herself before her birth.

The bond between Asif and Pia were wonderful **affectionate love** which makes Asif comfortable to take care of her and made Pia to call him A.A in short, shares incidents which she faces in her life.
