Introduction

It helps citizens connect with their government and express their needs and opinions.

In the past, political leaders and parties shared their messages through newspapers, radio, television, and public meetings. These traditional forms of media were very important in reaching people and spreading information. But in recent years, the situation has changed completely. With the rise of the internet and social media, political communication has entered a new digital phase. Today, social media platforms like Facebook, Instagram, X (Twitter), and WhatsApp are the main sources of news and political discussion for millions of people, especially the youth.

Rise of Political Memes

Among the many forms of online communication, memes have become one of the most popular and powerful tools. However, political memes can also be misleading. Since they are short and often humorous, they do not always show the full truth. Sometimes memes spread false information, exaggerate facts, or promote biased opinions. They can influence people's thinking without them realizing it. Youth and Political Memes

India is one of the youngest countries in the world. More than half of its population is below the age of 35. Most young people spend a lot of time online, using mobile phones and social media every day. They prefer digital platforms over newspapers or TV for news and discussions. For this reason, the youth have become the main target for political communication on social media.

Political memes appeal to young people because they are short, funny, and easy to understand. A meme can make a political issue look simple and interesting. It allows young users to laugh, think, and even share their own opinions. Many young people get their first ideas about politics through memes they see online. This shows that memes play a role in shaping how the youth see politics, leaders, and elections.

At the same time, memes also give young people a chance to take part in political discussions. They share, comment, or create memes to express what they feel about politics. This makes them active participants instead of just silent viewers. However, not all memes are positive or informative. Some memes are used to attack political opponents or spread fake news. Because of this, it is important to study what kind of messages memes spread and how they affect the political thinking of young people.

Political Campaigns and Social Media in India

The use of social media in politics became more visible during the 2014 and 2019 Indian general elections. Political parties began to use social media for campaigning, public communication, and image-building. Along with videos, hashtags, and advertisements, memes became a common part of digital campaigns. These memes helped parties connect with young voters in a more personal and entertaining way.

Social media allows political parties to communicate directly with people without depending on newspapers or TV channels. Memes, in particular, help leaders appear more relatable and modern. They are shared not only by official party pages but also by volunteers, supporters, and influencers. This has created a new kind of political environment online, where humour and creativity play a major role in shaping opinions.

Today memes have become so popular and influential, it is important to study them carefully. This research focuses on understanding how political memes affect young audiences. It looks at what kind of

tone, style, and message these memes use, and how often they appear on social media. By analysing memes, this study will find out whether they help increase political awareness among youth or simply spread biased opinions.

Literature review:

The paper “Political Memes and Perceptions: A Study of Memes as a Political Communication Tool in the Indian Context” by Saumya Rastogi and Simran Kashyap (2019) explores how memes are used to share political ideas and influence people’s opinions in India. The study explains that memes, which combine humour and visuals, can simplify complex political issues and make them easier to understand for a large audience, especially the youth. Using content analysis and a survey, the researchers examined ten popular political memes from 2018–2019 and gathered responses from 100 young social media users. The findings showed that most participants understood the meaning of the memes and found them engaging and informative. Memes helped spread awareness about political issues but also risked spreading biased or incomplete information. The study found that memes are an effective form of digital political communication, making political discussions more interesting and accessible. However, they should be used responsibly and supported by facts. The authors concluded that while memes have become a powerful way to connect with the youth, they can also shape or distort political perceptions depending on how they are created and shared.

The paper written by Dr. Anushka Kulkarni in 2017 explains how internet memes are used to communicate political ideas and humour. The study focuses on the use of memes as a tool for political satire and how they affect people’s opinions in India. It says that memes have become a part of modern political communication, where people share jokes and images about leaders, parties, and current issues. The research also shows that memes make political topics more interesting and increase public participation, especially among young internet users.

The study used questionnaires and content analysis to find out how people respond to political memes. It included both digital natives and digital migrants. Most people agreed that memes can be used for political communication but felt that they do not strongly influence voting behaviour or major political opinions. Memes were seen as entertaining and engaging but not as serious sources of political information.

The researcher concludes that internet memes are a growing part of online political discourse. They help spread awareness and encourage discussion, but they mainly act as a form of humour rather than a strong influence on public decisions. The study shows that while memes add colour and creativity to politics, traditional media still plays a more powerful role in shaping political views.

The paper “Social Media Memes and Political Participation of Indian Youth” by Dr. Vikas Dogra and Chetan Tripathi (2024) studies how political memes on social media influence the thoughts and participation of young people in India. The researchers explain that memes have become a major form of online political expression because they mix humour and criticism to discuss political issues in a simple way. The study used a survey among youth aged 18–29 from Shimla, Himachal Pradesh, and analysed how often they view, share, and respond to political memes. The findings show that most young people see memes as an important way to express opinions and share ideas, but memes do not strongly motivate them to take part in real political actions like voting or campaigning. The paper concludes that memes mainly help youth discuss and express their political views online. They act more as tools for

communication and entertainment rather than serious sources of political influence, although they still play a role in shaping awareness and online engagement.

Objectives

1. To examine the exposure of youth to political memes on social media.
2. To analyze the influence of political memes on the political awareness of youth.
3. To study the impact of political memes on the opinions and attitudes of young audiences.

Research methodology:

This study uses the survey method to understand how political memes on social media influence young audiences. The main aim of this method is to collect responses from young people regarding their exposure to political memes on different social media platforms. Through a structured questionnaire, the researcher attempts to examine how young audiences perceive political memes, how frequently they view and share them, and how these memes influence their political opinions and attitudes.

Sample:

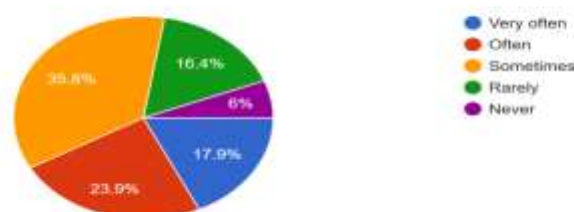

The survey was conducted among youth who actively use social media platforms such as Instagram, Facebook, and X (Twitter). The responses collected from the participants were analysed to identify patterns in how political memes affect the views and engagement of young audiences in political discussions.

Data Analysis:

The collected survey data was analyzed to understand the influence of political memes on young audiences. The responses were organized and presented using graphs to make the interpretation clear and easy to understand. The analysis focuses on aspects such as how frequently young people encounter political memes on social media, the platforms where these memes are commonly seen, whether memes help audiences understand political issues, and the perception that political memes may sometimes spread misleading information. By examining these responses, the data analysis helps explain how political memes are experienced and interpreted by young social media users and how they contribute to shaping political awareness in the digital environment.

67 responses

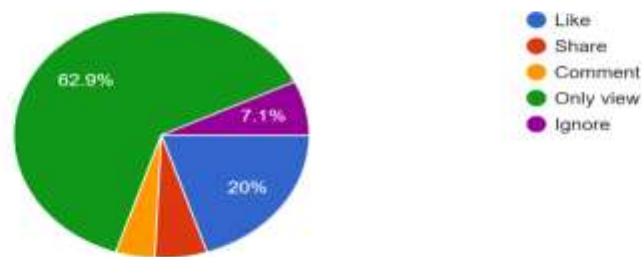


The data shows that political memes are commonly seen by respondents on social media. Out of the total 67 participants, 24 respondents (35.8%) stated that they sometimes see political memes, which represents the largest share of the responses. 16 respondents (23.9%) reported that they often see political memes, while 12 respondents (17.9%) indicated that they see them very often. In contrast, 11 respondents (16.4%) mentioned that they rarely see political memes, and only 4 respondents (6%) stated that they never see such content on social media.

This distribution indicates that a large majority of respondents encounter political memes at least occasionally in their social media environment. The findings suggest that political memes are widely circulated and form a noticeable part of the digital content experienced by young audiences. The frequent appearance of such memes reflects the growing role of social media as a platform for political expression and communication.

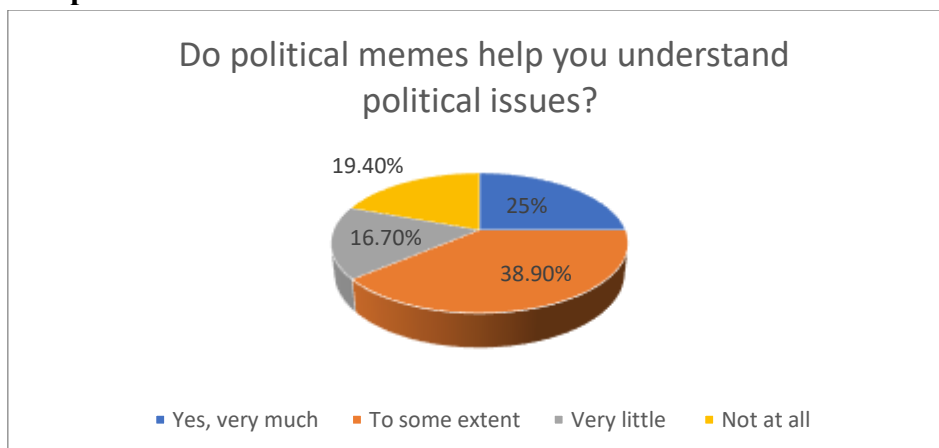
Interaction With Political Memes

70 responses



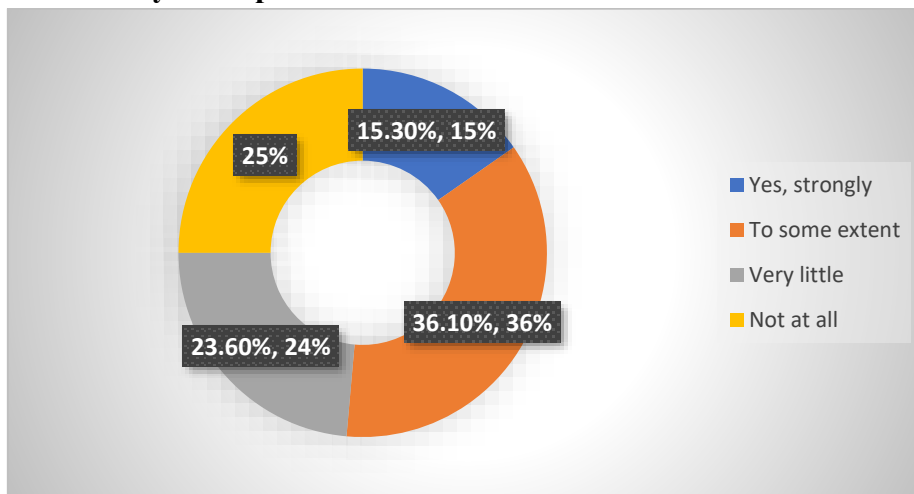
The survey shows how people interact with political memes based on 70 responses. Most people (62.9%) only look at the memes and do not do anything else, which means they prefer to just watch quietly. Around 20% of people like the memes, showing a small level of interest. Some people (7.1%) ignore political memes completely. Very few people share or comment on them, which means not many are ready to express their opinions openly. Overall, the result shows that people mostly see political memes but do not actively take part in them, possibly because they do not want to get involved in political discussions.

Political memes helps to Understand Political issues



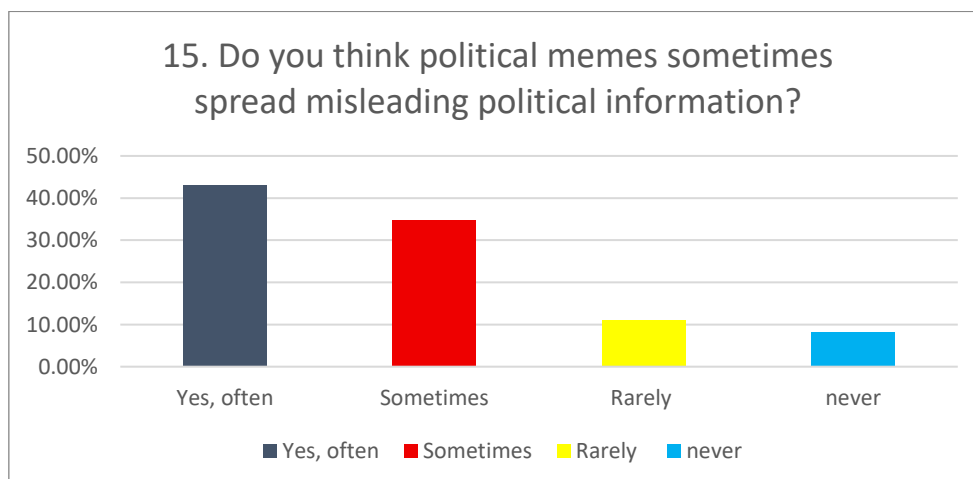
The survey results show how political memes help people understand political issues, based on 72 responses. Around 38.9% of respondents said political memes help them to some extent, which is the highest share, meaning many people get a basic idea but not complete understanding. About 25% said yes, very much, showing that a good number of people find memes very helpful for understanding politics. However, 16.7% of respondents said very little, and 19.4% said not at all, which means a noticeable group feels memes are not useful for learning political issues. Overall, the results suggest that political memes help many people understand politics at a simple level, but they are not fully reliable or effective for everyone.

Political memes Influence youth opinion



The survey shows how political memes influence people’s opinions about political leaders or parties, based on 72 responses. The largest group (36.1%) said memes influence them to some extent, which means many people are affected a little but not strongly. About 15.3% said yes, strongly, showing that only a small number are highly influenced. On the other hand, 23.6% said very little and 25% said not at all, which means nearly half of the respondents feel memes do not really change their opinions. Overall, the results suggest that political memes have some influence on people, but for most, the impact is moderate or low rather than strong

Misleading of Political Memes



The survey shows whether people think political memes spread misleading political information, based on 72 responses. The largest group (43.1%) said yes, often, which means many people believe memes frequently spread wrong or misleading information. Another 34.7% said sometimes, showing that a big number also feel misinformation happens occasionally. Around 11.1% said rarely, and only a very small number said never, meaning very few people think memes are completely safe or accurate. About 8.3% selected another option. Overall, the results clearly show that most people believe political memes can spread misleading information, either often or sometimes.

Data interpretation:

Youth are exposed to political memes on social media

The data shows that most youth are highly exposed to political memes, as a majority of respondents regularly view them on social media platforms. However, most of them prefer to only watch the content rather than actively engage by liking, sharing, or commenting. This clearly indicates that political memes have a wide reach among young audiences, but their participation remains mostly passive. This passive behavior may be due to lack of interest in expressing opinions publicly or fear of criticism in political discussions. Even though engagement is low, continuous exposure suggests that memes are an important part of the media consumption habits of youth.

Political memes influence the political awareness of youth

The results show that political memes help youth understand political issues to some extent. Many respondents feel that memes give them a basic idea about political topics, while some say they are very helpful. However, a noticeable number of respondents feel that memes do not help much in understanding politics. This indicates that political memes can create awareness in a simple and easy way, but they do not provide detailed or complete knowledge. Even though they are not fully reliable, memes still play an important role in introducing political information to young people.

Political memes affect the opinions and attitudes of youth

The findings show that political memes have some influence on the opinions and attitudes of youth. Most respondents say that memes influence them to some extent, while only a few feel strongly influenced. At the same time, many respondents report little or no influence. In addition, a large number of people believe that political memes often or sometimes spread misleading information. This suggests that while memes can shape opinions, their impact is limited and may not always be accurate. Overall, political memes play a role in influencing youth, but the effect is moderate and depends on how individuals understand and interpret the content.

Findings:

1. Most youth are highly exposed to political memes on social media.
2. The majority of respondents prefer to only view memes rather than engage with them.
3. Active participation like sharing and commenting is very low among youth.
4. Political memes have a wide reach but limited interaction.
5. Many youth feel memes help them understand political issues to some extent.
6. Some respondents find political memes very helpful for basic awareness.
7. A noticeable number of youth feel memes do not provide enough understanding.

8. Political memes influence opinions, but mostly at a moderate level.
9. Only a small number of respondents feel strongly influenced by political memes.
10. Many respondents believe political memes can spread misleading information.

Conclusion:

The overall conclusion of the study shows that political memes have become an important part of social media use among youth, with most young people regularly viewing such content. However, their engagement remains mostly passive, as they prefer to watch rather than actively like, share, or comment. Political memes help in creating basic awareness and make political issues easier to understand, but they usually provide only simple and limited information instead of deep knowledge. The influence of memes on opinions and attitudes is moderate, as many youth feel slightly influenced while only a few feel strongly affected, and some are not influenced at all. At the same time, there is a strong concern that political memes can spread misleading or inaccurate information. Overall, the study concludes that political memes are effective in reaching youth and creating initial awareness, but their impact is limited and not always reliable, making it important for young people to think carefully and verify information before forming opinions.

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
